#### Cheat Race 2016 – Record High Water By Jim Hunt

The 21<sup>st</sup> running of the Cheat River Race was one for the record books. The race is normally run in the Cheat Canyon the night before Cheat Fest with a water level between 1.5 and 5.0 feet. This year, starting Thursday, the racers were warned by the race organizers that very high water was likely and to check back in with them on Friday at 10:00 am for a update before running shuttle. By Friday am the water was well over 7 feet and still rising fast. By noon they informed the racers that the race, if held, would be in the Cheat Narrows and to meet at 4:20 for an update.

By the 6:00 pm race time, the water level was 7.85 feet and 12,300 cfs at Albright. None of Team Keelhaulers had ever been on the

Narrows above 6,000 cfs, so this was a major level increase and consideration of not racing was discussed.

The race was to be held starting in Rowlesburg, WV and finishing at the new FOC takeout about a mile below the normal Narrows takeout - about 7 miles total with 4 miles of that being flat water. Jim Hunt, Cliff Wire and Michael Duvall all scouted the entire race course and determined - we can do this. A quick call to Debbie Avallone to tell her "we all agree you can do this!" and we were ready to go along with Bill Warble.

There were 81 racers, 13 of whom were woman. Of the 81, 26 were from Liquid Adventures Kayak School. This is down from more like 120-140 racers in a normal water level Cheat Race. The race organizers: Garrett Thompson, Rick Gusic and JJ got us all shuttled and upriver for a river bank Lemans start. Team Keelhaulers all picked creek boats for the big water safety factor except Bill who was in a downriver race boat. And, we were off paddling in a group of 4 except for Bill who was going fast with the race boats. Lots of current in the flat water. Once the rapids started, there were Grand Canyon size wavetrains and lots of strange eddies and few monster holes. The sight of rescue volunteers on shore was an indication that things were about to get really exciting. Calamity Rock was the big rapid on the run but had a decent line thru it - glad we scouted it. We were running sweep for the race since Stubby is dog slow, and except for Bill, we all stayed upright and in our boats for the entire race. The winning time was 35:54 minutes with our group finishing in the rear at about 51:00 minutes.

We did have a prize winner as Debbie Avallone riding Stubby took 2nd place in Woman's Class D. From Debbie: Ok, there were only two women in Class D. Thanks to the KH crew for sacrificing their race times to see that the poky Stubby & I had a good, safe run.

We all had fun, and once the run was over, were glad we raced. How often do you get to run the Cheat Narrows at Grand Canyon flows.
