First Gauley Weekend

I guess the warm weather and the dry rivers elsewhere brought out the paddlers for the first weekend of the Summersville Lake drawdown. Jim Hunt was the trip organizer for the Lower Gauley on Friday and Saturday. I organized the camping at Battle Run Campground and the Upper Gauley trips on Saturday and Sunday. There were so many club paddlers that we needed to get 5 campsites which were packed by the 32 paddlers. We had many old paddlers which allowed us to purchase the campsites for half price. The cost of camping per person came to only \$2/nite.

On Saturday, we had 4 groups of paddlers but we combined the shuttling to make it easier. Six paddlers ran what we call the Marathon, putting in at the dam and running the Upper Gauley and the Lower Gauley. Twenty Three paddlers split into two groups running the Lower Gauley from Woods Ferry to Swiss while 5 of us ran the upper Gauley down to Woods Ferry. In spite of a lot of flips our Upper group was swimless and finished early.

The weather was warm and sunny and most of the paddlers headed out to local restaurants before coming back for a nice campfire. You could see the shore line of the lake drop about 6" each day from the drawdown. On Sunday I decided to take a rest while 11 paddlers headed to the Lower Gauley and a small 3 man group and 9 others headed to the Upper Gauley. Both groups had some problems. Jackie Blackwood was experiencing her first Upper Gauley run and Gib McGill was back after about a 6 year hiatus. After a short swim Gib was feeling uneasy about his run but did not communicate this to the group. After sucessfully running one of the hardest rapids, Pillow, and making the right hand eddy he decided to watch the last three paddlers run the rapid. He got out of his boat to get a better view of Cliff, Muchael and Jackienbut never saw their run or Jackie's swim with the group helping her downstream and around the corner. He went back to his kayak and waited.

The group knew he was OK and waited downstream for him to float around the corner, but no Gib. Gib made his next error by sitting there wondering where everyone went instead of floating around the rocks to find his group. He then decided to walk out all the way up the hard climb from Pillow to Carnifex Ferry. If he wanted out, he should have told the group who ended up waiting in several places for at least an hour and a half. He spoiled their day because of his lack of communication. There is nothing wrong with walking rapids or taking out if you lack the confidence but you must communicate with the group and listen to their advise also. It turns out that if he would have told them, they could have pointed out a less steep walk out and they could have gone on their way and finished their day much earlier.

For her first run on the Upper Gauley, Jackie did great. It's big pushy water and intimidated her for a while, but she made it through OK.

An even bigger problem happened to the small three man group on the Upper. Doug Smith, John Greer and Bob Nicholson got an early start head to home early. Everything went well until Iron Ring. Bob ran last and flipped and hit his head, knocking him out. Doug and John were waiting nearby and quickly chased the upside down boat. They pulled Bob up and he came out but was breathing but a little foggy. He didn't respond to their commands to let go of his boat and paddle, so they could quickly get him to shore. The 3 drifted downstream until a raft finally pulled Bob in while they got his gear to shore. He had a cut on his forehead but remembered nothing from his experience. He was able to regain his senses and paddle the remainder of the rapids to the Panther Mountain take-out and walk up the hill. Accidents happen and the tight 3 man group took care of the mishap well, but it pointed out to never take your eyes off of anyone in the group until everyone is safely down and it is sure good to have a third boat to help in any emergencies.

Our club has similar trips coming up for the rest of the Gauley drawdown dates. Know your limitations, don't put yourself or your group at risk. Call the trip organizers before showing up, so they are aware of what you want to paddle and your skill level. Have a good time.
